July 2, 1776 - After a prolonged debate, the Congress voted unanimously (12-0), but secretly, for complete independence from the Kingdom of Great Britain.

John Adams, wrote to his wife Abigail on July 3:
"The second day of July, 1776, will be the most memorable epoch in the history of America. I am apt to believe that it will be celebrated by succeeding generations as the great anniversary festival. It ought to be commemorated as the day of deliverance, by solemn acts of devotion to God Almighty. It ought to be solemnized with pomp and parade, with shows, games, sports, guns, bells, bonfires, and illuminations, from one end of this continent to the

other, from this time forward for evermore."

July 4, 1776 - The Congress reworked the text of the Declaration till July 4th, when twelve colonies voted for adoption. John Hancock, President of the Continental Congress, was the first to sign the Declaration of Independence. It is said that he signed his name "with a great flourish" so "King George can read that without spectacles!"

July 6, 1776 - The **Pennsylvania Evening Post** is the first newspaper to print the Declaration of Independence.

July 8, 1776 - Philadelphia celebrated the Declaration with public readings and bonfires on July 8. The bell in Independence Hall, then known as the "Province Bell" would later be renamed the "Liberty Bell" after its inscription - "Proclaim Liberty Throughout All the Land Unto All the Inhabitants Thereof."

ELDERLY AND LOOKING FOR DENTAL CARE?

The Pennsylvania Dental Association sponsors a Senior Dental Care Program enabling many seniors to obtain affordable dental care. Participating referral dentists offer a minimum discount of 15 percent off their usual fees for patients who meet the program's basic requirements. In order to eligible, a patient must fulfill all of the following requirements:

Be a Pennsylvania resident

Be age 65 or older

Not be receiving federal, state or other dental health assistance

Not have private dental insurance

Have a total annual household income of less than \$14,500 for a single person or less than \$17,700 for a married couple

To enroll contact the Office of Aging or the United Way of PA to request a PDA Senior Dental Care Program mail-in registration brochure. Also request a list of participating dentists. It is up to you to make an appointment by calling the dentist's office, but be sure to tell the receptionist that you are a patient in the Senior Dental Care Program.
